

Muni Metro Rail Center -- This \$16 million project will be the storage and maintenance facility for the 100 Light Rail Vehicles being purchased by the San Francisco Municipal Railway from the Boeing Corporation in Philadelphia. The LRVs will replace the present streetcars in San Francisco and the new system will be known at the Muni Metro. The cars will operate in the Muni level of the Market Street Subway and on the outer sections surface rail network currently utilized by streetcars.
