FEBRUARY MEETING

DATE: FEBRUARY 15, 1979.

PLACE: NAVAL AIR STATION, ALAMEDA.

Professional Engineering Registration Program

CERTIFICATION OF TECHNICIANS

Civil, Mechanical, and Electrical/Electronic technicians should begin preparing for the Certified Engineering Technician (CET) examinations to be given locally on May 5 by the National Society of Professional Engineers.

Three 14-week classroom reviews covering mathematics, physical sciences and engineering skills will be held at Menlo College in Menlo Park starting the week of January 29. The courses are offered by the Professional Engineering Institute. A no-cost introductory meeting covering technician certification will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the SBA Building at Menlo College on January 24. Descriptive literature and more information can be obtained by calling (415) 593-9731.

Certification is the only official recognition of ability, achievement, and professionalism available to engineering technicians. The CET license is recognized nationally, needs no renewal exams, and is valid in all states.
