

Soviet Academy of Sciences Signs Agreement

with U.S. Engineering Society ASME and the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences have signed an agreement for scientific and technical cooperation, including the exchange of U.S. and Soviet engineers.

including the exchange of U.S. and Soviet engineers.

The agreement was signed in the Soviet Union by Academician Konstantin Frolov, vice president of the Academy

of Sciences. The academy is the organizing and governing body for all science and engineering research and education in the U.S.S.R. Richard Rosenberg signed the agreement during the 1988 winter annual meeting.

The academy and ASME hope to promote the dissemination and exchange of scientific technical knowledge specifical-

ly in the field of mechanical engineering in order to serve the interests of engineering in both countries.

The cooperative efforts will include the exchange of technical scientific publications of mutual interest and symposia on specialized subjects of mutual interest. Engineers will participate in national conferences held in the U.S.S.R. and

the U.S., and scientific papers and books will be published.

In the U.S., an advisory group consisting of representatives from ASME, industry, academia, government, and research
